

CALL FOR PARTICIPANTS

Deakin and Gordon Students and Staff

Develop your experience and skills by working in industry for a week.

WHAT IS IT?

- The Science and Technology in Industry Program is for teams of tertiary students or teachers to work in a local industry on a technology based project.
- Teams will receive one day's training in Quality principles and tools, effective teamwork and systematic problem solving as preparation for a work placement.
- Teams will spend 5 days working in a local Geelong industry on a real issue being experienced by that business. It will be real work in a real work environment.
- An Exhibition after the placement will showcase the teams' experiences and outcomes.

WHO IS IT FOR?

- Any tertiary student, including postgraduates, or staff from Deakin University or the Gordon Institute of TAFE.
- Each team will ideally consist of 4 participants: 2 from Science / Engineering / Technology and 2 from other disciplines from both Deakin and the Gordon.
- Separate teams will be formed of students and teachers/academics.

WHY BE INVOLVED?

- Students and staff will benefit from the application of knowledge, skills and aptitudes in a real industry context and the opportunity to develop a networking relationship with a local business.
- Students will demonstrate their skills for potential vacation, project or graduate employment.
- Staff will have a concrete experience of current industry needs and processes which will provide the opportunity to evolve curriculum to better suit industry needs through establishment of an ongoing relationship with industry and networking with other tertiary institutes.

WHEN IS IT?

- You must commit for the full program: one day's training, one week in industry, plus an Exhibition of your team's findings.
- Training day: Thursday 1st December. (Gordon Professional Development Centre)
Five day work placement: Monday 5th to Friday 9th December.
Exhibition: Friday 9th December 3:30 - 5:00 pm (Café on Tracks)
